What does it mean to have a home rule charter? Parishes may choose to operate under the home rule authority, and if so, they may exercise any power and perform any function necessary or proper for the management of their affairs not defined by general law.

How many parishes are under home rule charters? 16

Parishes with a population larger than 10,000 must have no fewer than 5 members and no more than 15.

What three things must a person be to qualify for a Police Juror?

- 1. 18 years old
- 2. State resident for the preceding 2 years
- 3. Lived in the district they seek to represent for the preceding year

How long is a Police Juror's term in office? 4 years

In general, what is the Police Jury responsible for in the parish? Levy taxes and administer those funds for parish operations both inside incorporated areas and territories in the Parish outside of cities, towns and villages.

The Calcasieu Parish Police Jury is a council/manager form of government.

What are the parish's five standing committees?

- 1. Public Works
- 2. Ways & Means
- 3. Agenda
- 4. Personnel
- 5. Budget

It adopts ordinances and resolutions to regulate matters affecting public safety, health, convenience and good order of the Parish.

The Police Jury repairs and expands public property that belongs to the Parish. Two best known examples mentioned on the website are:

- 1. Parish Courthouse
- 2. Calcasieu Correctional Center

In order to conduct different Parish operations the Police Jury furnishes funds for:

- 1. Manpower
- 2. Equipment
- 3. Supplies

15 Jurors are elected to serve 15 single-member districts that cover the whole parish.

A Juror stays in office for 4 years.

Juror's are paid \$1,200.00 per month.

How often are the President and Vice-President elected? Annually in January

The Police Jury meets Two times per month.
