# Disaster Funding Timeline

**SEPT. 2021**

Disaster recovery funding package authorized by Congress.

**OCT. 2021**

The U.S. Dept. of Housing and Urban Development allocates \$600 million in funding to the state of Louisiana for all recovery needs associated with Hurricanes Laura and Delta.

**JAN. 31, 2022**

HUD releases Federal Register Notice, providing guidance for how the state must spend allocated funding.

**JAN. 31, 2022**

The state opens survey for homeowners affected by Hurricanes Laura and Delta.

**FEB. 21, 2022**

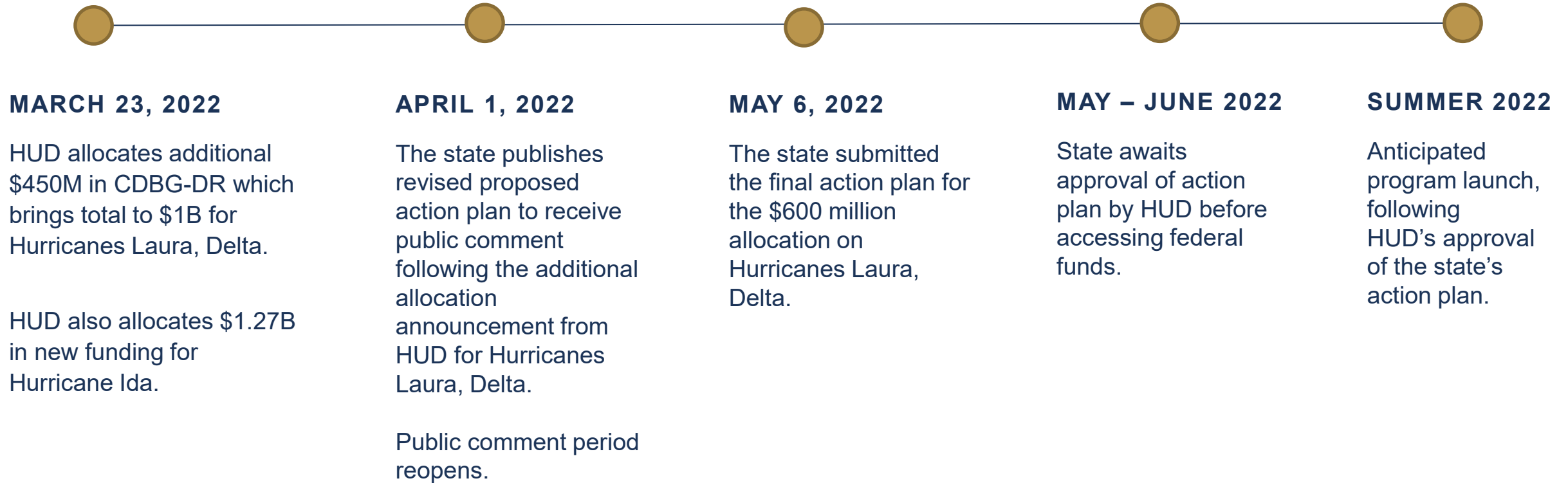
The state publishes proposed action plan to receive public comment for initial \$600 million allocation for Hurricanes Laura and Delta.



\*State currently waiting for Federal Register Notice from HUD for the \$450 million additional allocation for Hurricanes Laura, Delta and the \$1.27 billion allocation for Hurricane Ida.

# State of Louisiana's Allocations for 2020 and 2021 Federally Declared Disasters

Louisiana has been allocated over \$1 billion to support long-term recovery efforts for Hurricanes Laura and Delta, and \$1.27 billion to support recovery efforts for Hurricane Ida.

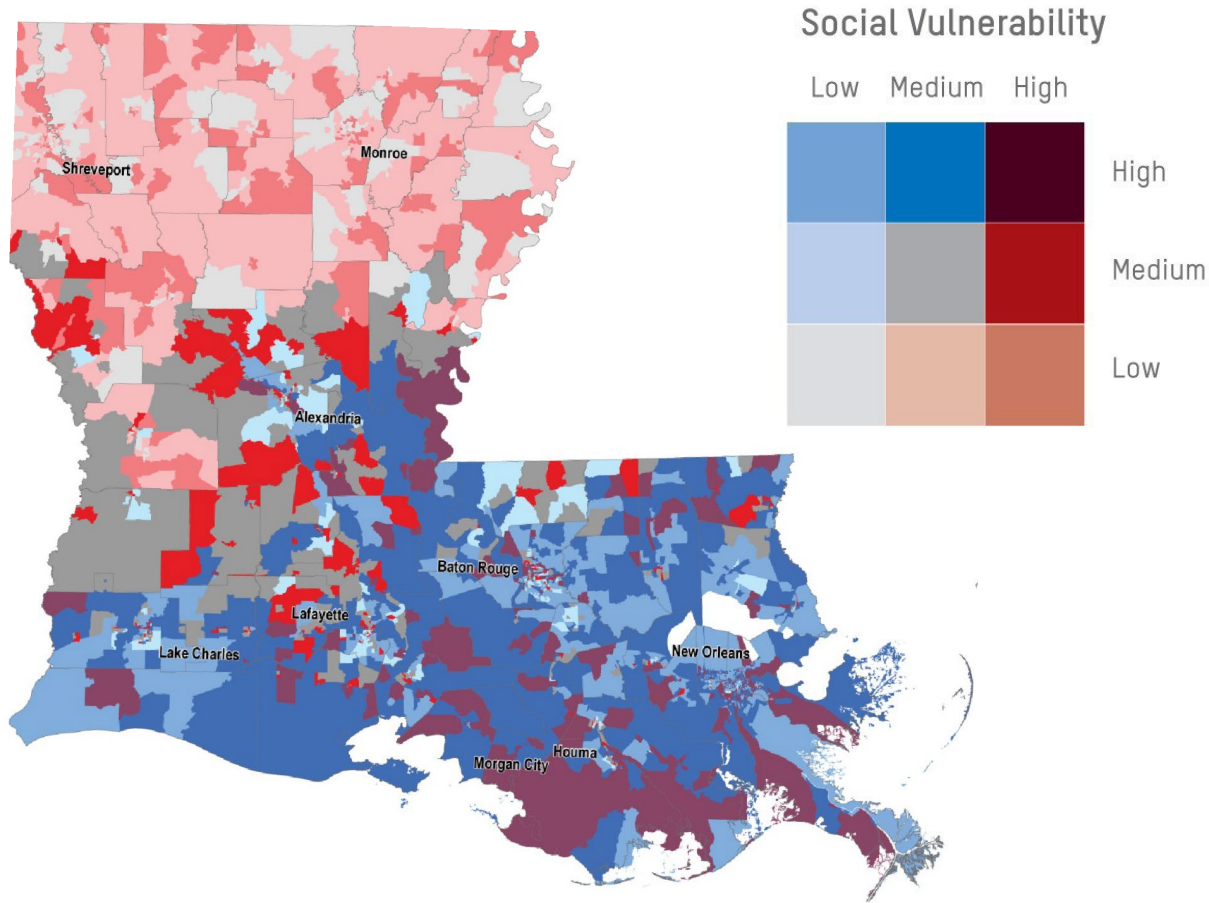

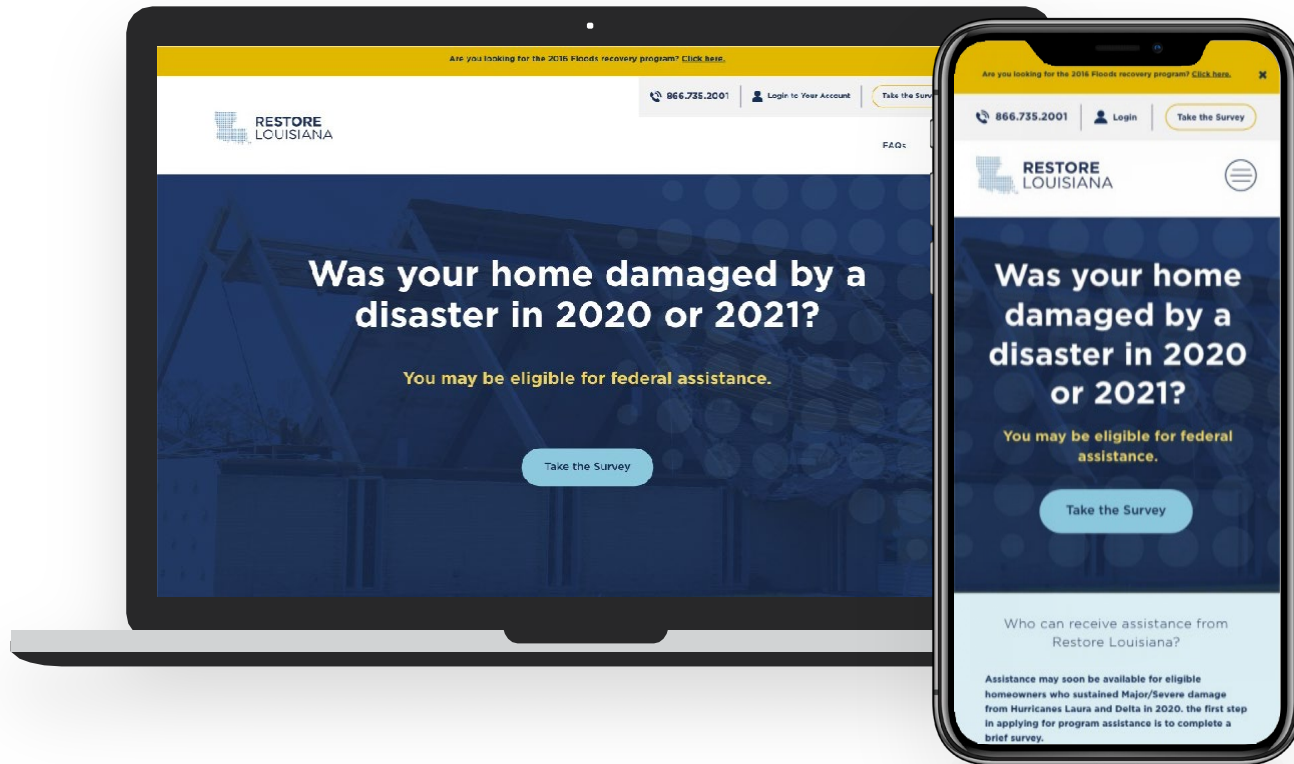
- Launch homeowner assistance program survey
