Brenda was also able to gain employment at Lake Charles Memorial Hospital as a Medical Assistant working full-time making \$15.00 an hour. Brenda was grateful that the WIOA youth program was able to help with her schooling, so that she can get started in her career as a medical assistant and later in the future would like to further her education in the medical field.
