 the parish determine priorities and focus areas for the future.








respondent demographics





how CPPJ can improve these services

DISASTER RECOVERY

Continue cleaning debris from weather events and repairing buildings

Increase preparation for weather events and recovery to improve future recovery efforts

Provide more equal assistance across the parish, ensuring citizens in low income or rural areas receive sufficient assistance

LITTER

Better enforce litter laws and levy higher fines against citizens that litter

Pick up litter more frequently

Utilize inmate cleanup crews to conduct additional litter pick-ups

Have dedicated clean up efforts for roadways, bridges, and ditches

DRAINAGE

Increase frequency of ditch, culvert, lateral, and waterway cleanings

Improve drainage planning, especially around new developments

Monitor drainage issues more closely to proactively address issues

how CPPJ can improve these services

PARISH-WIDE DEVELOPMENT

Focus on attracting and growing new business, especially local businesses

Increase long-term planning efforts and coordination between cities

Improve overall infrastructure, repair or demolish damaged buildings, and improve the overall appearance of the parish

TRAFFIC/ TRANSPORTATION

Many roads in the parish are in need of repair

Provide additional public transportation options, including adding more routes and expanding the dates and times that current routes operate

Better coordinate construction projects to prevent overlapping road closures

OTHER INFRASTRUCTURE

Build a new I-10 bridge


Continue to repair roads

Address the water quality issues across the parish


Expand and improve sewer services

Continue cleaning up litter and debris


satisfaction with customer service from CPPJ employees



knowing where to go to resolve specific issues




satisfaction with information sharing and warning during emergency events


satisfaction with long-term recovery following 2020-21 weather events


