Consideration of adopting a resolution amending a resolution adopted by the Police Jury on September 22, 2011, to authorize Waterworks District No. Twelve of Ward Three of Calcasieu Parish, Louisiana, to proceed with development of a project for acquisition and establishment of additions and improvements of the waterworks system for and within the District, involving issuance of not exceeding \$2,000,000 Water Revenue Bonds, 2013 Series, making application to the State Bond Commission, and providing for other matters in connection therewith.

18. Consideration of adopting a resolution indicating objection/no objection to the following proposed project in Calcasieu Parish, Louisiana, provided said work meets with the rules and regulations of the Corps of Engineers, Best Management Practices during the course of construction set forth by the Environmental Protection Agency guidelines, and approvals are received from all other appropriate state and federal agencies, and further that any required permits are obtained from the Division of Planning and Development:

Proposal of Karen Rae Dulany, c/o Brenda Underwood, to install and maintain 59-feet of vinyl bulkhead and place approximately 900 cubic yards of hauled-in material behind the bulkhead, all for erosion protection purposes. Said project is located at 110 Shell Beach Drive within the City of Lake Charles. *The Planning Staff recommends that the Police Jury indicate no objection to this project application*.

AGENDA NOTE: Any resolution of no objection to any project, if adopted, will stipulate that such "no objection" is based solely on evaluation by the Parish Planning and Development Staff relative to the project's compliance with current parish ordinances and provisions, and that no environmental assessment was made, and further, requesting the agencies and/or individuals with environmental expertise to make an evaluation and forward their findings to the U.S. Corps of Engineers.

19. **Take appropriate action** on a request by Arrozal, LLC, and Lacassane Company to amend Ordinance No. 5999, which was adopted on October 20, 2011, to decrease the lot size requirements on the northwest corner of Highway 14 and Highway 397 in Ward Three (RZ03-016-12). (District 9, Mr. Guidry)

20. Consideration of adopting a resolution approving a lease agreement between the Police Jury and Walter and Sharon Anderson, in the amount of \$100.00 annually, for the property located at 1315 S. Rue Des Chene, Westlake, which was acquired through a flood mitigation grant and must remain "open space," and further, authorizing the President of the Police Jury, or his designee, when appropriate, to execute all documents related thereto. <u>AGENDA NOTE</u>: The project will be located south of Sulphur, off of State Highway 27, south of the Intracoastal Waterway.

22. Consideration of adopting a resolution to amend a resolution adopted by the Police Jury on March 23, 2006, which approved the submittal of applications to the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program, Governor's Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness, for elevation and acquisition of buildings that had repetitively flooded or sustained substantial damage, said amendment to the March 23, 2006 resolution being to allow for elevation of houses on slabs; and further, to ratify the elevation of those structures (on slabs) which have been done since April of 2011.

<u>AGENDA NOTE</u>: Due to a limited number of contractors at the time the original resolution was adopted in March of 2006, houses on slabs were not going to be elevated, and the resolution excluded these structures; however, since April of 2011, houses on slabs have been elevated.
